The **District Development Committee (DDC)** meeting was chaired by Sri Nibedan Das Patowary, ACS, District Commissioner, Nalbari. At the very outset, the Income Tax Officer, Nalbari presented a power point presentation for spreading awareness about ITR-U and to review the deductions/exemptions/claims made in the ITRs under different section of the Income-tax Act, 1961, filed to avoid scrutiny.

Then the meeting commenced with the Power Point presentations submitted by the Heads of Departments on the progress of various schemes, which were then reviewed by the house.
